

This year KIS is introducing a new Cambridge subject that is called Global Perspectives. It is not a content driven discipline, doing GP Challenges students will develop skills necessary in all other subjects and out of school. The skills are: Research, Evaluation, Analysis, Collaboration, Communication and Reflection. The first Challenge we did was "What makes us human?" We focused on Research and Communication mainly, and by the end of the Challenge students presented their projects on the humanrelated issues that they investigated (Are humans the only ones who can care? Are humans the only ones who can be affected by their self-esteem? Are humans the only ones who can communicate, etc.) After holidays we are going to start a new Challenge - "What everyone needs?"
